## **Comments and Feedback**

This publication has been prepared using the electoral maps made available by the Electoral Distribution Commission, and with reference to the transfers of enrolment from old to new boundaries. However, without access to registered voter lists indicating where people cast their vote, re-allocating polling places to new districts is an inexact science. ## INTRODUCTION

This publication contains an assessment of the political impact of the new state electoral boundaries for Western Australia. The final determination of the boundaries was released by the Electoral Distribution Commission (EDC) on 1 December 2023. The new boundaries will apply for the March 2025 election.

The EDC draws electoral boundaries based on criteria set down in the Electoral Act. The political impact of electoral boundaries is not an issue considered by the EDC, but clearly the Commission's decisions have political consequences. The aim of this publication is to assess the political change that flows from the Commission's final boundaries.

The redistribution was the first conducted since the abolition of Legislative Council regions. This removed the requirement that Legislative Assembly districts fit within Legislative Council regions. Under the previous rules applying since 1989, no Perth district had ever crossed the metropolitan boundary, and non-metropolitan districts had been required to conform to the land use definition of Legislative Council regions.

### The Redistribution Process

Two years after every state election, an Electoral Distribution Commission is appointed to re-draw the state's electoral boundaries. The process is designed to bring enrolments in lower house districts back within the permitted variation from average state enrolment.

Enrolments for the 59 districts drawn by the EDC must be within 10% of the average district enrolment (ADE) or quota, with an exception for districts greater than 100,000 square kilometres in area. These districts are granted a **large district allowance (LDA)**, 'notional' voters calculated as 1.5% of the area of the district. For these districts, enrolment plus the LDA must be between 20% under and 10% over the state average.

The primary task of the EDC is to meet the enrolment criteria set out in the previous paragraph. Within this restriction, the EDC may also take into consideration:

- community of interest
- land use patterns
- means of communication; means of travel and distance from Perth
- physical features
- existing boundaries of districts
- existing local government boundaries
- the trend of demographic changes.

The abolition of Legislative Council Regions meant the EDC did not have to take account of the previously legislated division between metropolitan and non-metropolitan regions, nor define non-metropolitan regions based upon land use.

The second-year anniversary of the last election set 13 March 2023 as the base enrolment date for the redistribution. A time line was made public for the various stages of the EDC's deliberations. The key dates in the process were:

- 1 April** – public call for suggestions
- 1 May** – closing date for suggestions
- 15 May** – closing date for comments on suggestions
- 21 July** – draft boundaries released
- 21 August** – closing date for objections to draft boundaries
- 1 December** – release of final boundaries.

### **The Task before the Commission**

The EDC established that the average district enrolment (ADE or quota) for the redistribution was 30,432. Except for districts where the LDA applied, all districts drawn by the EDC were required to have enrolment between 27,389 and 33,475. In districts where the LDA applied, the enrolment plus the LDA was required to be between 24,346 and 33,475.

Ten districts were outside of the permitted variation from average with eight metropolitan districts over quota and two country districts under quota. The three highest enrolment districts were on Perth's fringes, Baldivis (+18.0% over quota), Butler (+19.9%) and West Swan (+16.4%). North of Perth, Moore (-11.4%) and North West Central (-23.5% including LDA) were well under quota.

Full details of variance from quota for districts, both before and after the redistribution, can be found in tables beginning on page 7. For districts eligible for an LDA, the variation from quota is shown for both enrolment and enrolment plus LDA.

### **The Solution Adopted**

The major changes produced by the 2023 redistribution were largely confined to two areas. In the state's north, **North West Central** was abolished with 42.3% of the district's electors transferred to the new **Mid-West** seat, 41.1% to **Pilbara**, and smaller numbers to Geraldton and Kalgoorlie. The new seat of Mid-West largely replaces **Moore**, the new seat drawing four-fifths of its voters from Moore and one-fifth from North West Central.

As well as voters being transferred, the large district allowance that previously allowed North West Central to remain well under quota was distributed to Kalgoorlie and Kimberley. The Commissioner's report discusses in detail the transfer of extensive areas with no voters to allow geographically large districts to meet the state quota through large district allowance.

In southern Perth, a new seat called **Oakford** was created. This caused a cascade of changes to districts across southern Perth. Boundary changes north of the Swan involved smaller transfers of voters.

Four districts adopted new names. Two revived former districts names, **Burns Beach** re-named **Mindarie** and **Mirrabooka** reverting to its former name **Girrawheen**. Two new district names have been added to the state's electoral map, with **Warnbro** re-named **Secret Harbour** and **Willagee** adopting the name **Bibra Lake**. With the abolition of Legislative Council regions, Secret Harbour was extended across the metropolitan boundary to take in parts of Mandurah.

Most boundary changes were incremental. Nine districts are unchanged and another eight retain 100% of their former enrolment and expand in size. Fourteen districts retained 90% of their former enrolment, another 17 more than 80%. Only 11 districts underwent greater change, most of those a consequence of creating Oakford.



## **Details of Calculations and Methodology in this Publication**

To calculate the political impact of the new boundaries, the results of the 2021 election have been re-assigned to match the new electoral boundaries. This requires a series of assumptions to be made as part of the calculations. These assumptions concern whether votes are cast for candidates or parties, how to transfer polling places between old and new districts, and how to deal with the declaration vote from old districts.

### **Candidate versus Party Vote**

An assumption has been made that votes are cast for parties rather than candidates. This is a reasonable assumption, but ignores the importance of popular sitting members. A well-known sitting member may poll higher than their party would have with a different candidate. New electoral boundaries can add areas to a district where the party vote was not influenced at the last election by the presence of a sitting member.

### **Transferring Polling Places to Match the New Boundaries**

The Electoral Distribution Commission released enrolment data down to Bureau of Statistics SA1 level. This data has been used to calculate transfers of enrolment between old and new districts. The transfer of polling place results from old to new districts was guided by the enrolment transfers as well as the published maps. Where the transfers and maps suggest the catchment area of a polling place should be divided, an estimate has been made to divide the results of a polling place between new districts.

A table of the enrolment transfers from old to new districts can be found on page 75.

### **Dealing with the Declaration Vote**

For calculation purposes, all declaration votes (pre-poll, postal, absent, provisional) have been accumulated into a single total for transfer. The small number of Special Institutions, Hospital and Remote results have been treated as an ordinary polling places and transferred to new districts as appropriate.

Declaration votes have been transferred to new districts in proportion to the transfer of enrolment from old to new districts. However, the vote by party in the declaration vote has been weighted to reflect the vote by party in polling places transferred between districts.

As an example, the polling places in parts of North West Central transferred to Pilbara have a higher Labor vote than those areas transferred to Geraldton, Kalgoorlie or Mid-West. The declaration vote transfers have been weighted to reflect the party vote shares in the transferred polling places.

A major caveat for these calculations is the massive change to how people voted in 2021 due to on-going Covid restrictions. At the 2017 election, 63.5% of votes were cast within district on polling day compared to only 38.0% in 2021. Pre-poll voting more than doubled from 16.1% in 2017 to 39.9% in 2021, and Postal voting rose from 8.4% to 14.8%.

Weighting of declaration votes in redistribution calculations based on 2021 results has had to rely on a far smaller pool of polling day votes than for previous elections. While the decline of polling day votes should not impact on the relative margins calculated for new districts, it should be remembered that the margin for each district is an approximation.

### **By-elections and Changes in Party Membership**

This publication is based on the 2021 election results. Calculations do not take account of the 2022 North West Central or 2023 Rockingham by-elections.

North West Central was won by the National Party in 2021 with a margin versus Labor of 1.7%. The Labor Party did not nominate a candidate for the September 2022 by-election, and it was won by the National Party's Merome Beard with a margin of 10.5% versus the Liberal Party. As mentioned, North West Central has been abolished in the redistribution. New MLA Merome Beard has since joined the Liberal Party, but with the abolition of her seat, the change of party has not been considered in calculating new margins or party holdings. All calculations for successor seats to North West Central are based on 2021 election results, not the by-election.

The July 2023 Rockingham by-election followed the retirement of Premier and long-serving Rockingham Labor MLA Mark McGowan. He bequeathed an extra-ordinary 37.7% margin which was reduced to 15.2% for new Labor MLA Magenta Marshall, or 11.4% versus the second finishing Independent. Rockingham was left unchanged by the redistribution and 2021 election result has been used for the seat.

### **Two-Party Preferred versus Two-Candidate Preferred Results**

There was only one district at the 2021 election that did not finish as a two-party preferred contest between Labor and Liberal or National candidates. That was Fremantle where the Liberal Party finished third and Labor won the seat with a margin of 15.7% versus the Greens. The estimated Labor two-party preferred margin for Labor was 28.1%.

All calculations involving areas transferred from the old Fremantle have taken account of both two-candidate and two-party preferred results. Two new margins are provided for Fremantle throughout this publication. Areas of Fremantle transferred to Bibra Lake and Bicton do not alter to the two-party preferred contest in those seats.

At past elections, a handful of rural districts finished as Liberal versus National contests. This was not the case for the 2021 election with Labor being one of the final two contestants in every seat. Redistribution calculations do not alter the two-party preferred nature of the 2021 contests and all re-drawn districts remain Labor versus Liberal or National contests. Several re-drawn districts combine areas with more than one non-Labor opponent. Two-party margins in these seats have been calculated based on whichever of the Liberal and National candidates had the higher vote.

### **Legislative Council**

With the abolition of Legislative Council regions, there has been no need to consider the impact of the redistribution on the Legislative Council. The 2025 election will see the Legislative Council elected from a single state-wide electorate.

## Summary of the Political Impact

### Party Composition of Legislative Assembly based on Old and New Boundaries

No district changed party status based on the new electoral boundaries. The change in seats held by party is caused by –

- The National held seat of **North West Central** being abolished.
- The new seat of **Oakford** having a notional Labor majority.

In 19 districts the estimated new margin differs from the old margin by one percentage point or more, though 10 of these districts are very safe Labor seats with margins above 20%. Concentrating on districts with narrower margins, the following 16 districts are potentially in play at the 2025 election and have significantly changed margins.

### Swing to Change Government

Following the 2021 election, a change of government required the Liberal and National Parties to gain 24 seats from Labor on a uniform swing of 23.4%. On the new boundaries the equation is little changed at 25 seats on a uniform swing of 23.3%. A uniform swing of around 14% would be required to put the electoral pendulum back to where it approximately lined up after the 2017 election.

## DETAIL OF LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY DISTRICTS

### Format for Listings

For each new district, a summary of total vote by party is provided, as well as detail of transfers between old and new districts brought about by the redistribution.

The summary table includes an entry for all parties that contested polling places within the boundary of each new district. The table includes a total and percentage of first preference vote, two-candidate preferred vote and two-party preferred vote. Where a district includes transfers from districts with different combinations of two-candidate preferred contestants in 2021 (e.g. Albany), there may be more than two parties listed under the two-party and two-candidate preferred totals.

The final line of each summary table shows the calculated total votes transferred to the new district as a percentage of the total enrolment at the date of the redistribution.

After the summary table, a series of totals are provided that correspond to transfers of enrolment between old and new districts. There is a separate listing and total for each transfer. Transfers in from an old district are listed first, followed by transfers out of the existing district into new districts.
