


HASS WEEK CONFERENCE



REGIONAL OUTREACH TO ALBANY

In August, students, teachers and wider community members in Albany and Denmark had the opportunity to participate in the Parliamentary Education Civics and Citizenship program. Our Parliamentary Educators delivered numerous workshops to over 850 students throughout the week, as well as a Professional Learning Workshop to local teachers. A community workshop held at the City of Albany gave community participants the opportunity to meet their local member, Hon Peter Watson, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, and other members of State Parliament and ask questions about parliamentary democracy and how it operates in Western Australia.





KALGOORLIE. NEXT IN THE PIPELINE

The Parliamentary Education Office is about to embark upon another regional outreach program. This October, we will be visiting Kalgoorlie–Boulder and presenting 'Pop-up Parliaments' in both primary and secondary schools.
